For the past nine and a half years it has been my honor to be the executive director of the Loudon County Education Foundation. This year it has been especially true. As a nation, we have faced hard times over the past year. But as a true testament to our educational community, what has not broken us has made us stronger. Our educators and our students faced insurmountable challenges and as a result – education will be forever changed. We now have new resources, new methods, and new processes that will enable us to move into the future of education with new skills. Education after 2020 will never be the same as education before 2020. We are better, stronger and smarter.

The Board of Directors of the Education Foundation have worked hard to create an organization that supports education and makes a difference in the lives of people living in this community. Like all non-profits asking for contributions, 2020-21 was a hard fundraising year. We were forced to cancel many events. But our contributors saw the value of supporting education and The Foundation was able to contribute \$74,218 to the Loudon County/Lenoir City Educational Systems in 2020. As of 2012, The Loudon County Education Foundation has contributed \$800,765 to education in Loudon County. These contributions were made through scholarships to students, Classroom grants to teachers, Classroom supplies, books to children through Imagination Library, and STEM grants.

Lenoir City Schools is focused on providing the best learning experiences for all of our students. Our vision is to "Build Lenoir City's future...one student at a time." Lenoir City Elementary School provides a strong foundation in reading, writing, speaking and listening along with

skills in mathematics that supports learning in all areas. After school programs through the LEAPS program are also available during the school year. In the past year, Lenoir City Intermediate/Middle School was honored to receive the Tennessee STEM School Designation as a model school. Lenoir City High School was recognized as a Pathways School for our Mechatronics program. In addition, this year LCHS began a cyber security program with dual enrollment opportunities through Roane State. Additional opportunities for dual enrollment and industry certifications will be available through a grant which is allow LCHS to offer accredited classes in Building Trades for both students and adults in the 2021-2022 school year. LCHS offers curriculum and training in the following career areas: Engineering, STEM, Health Science, Animal Science, Digital Arts/Journalism, Marketing and Business, Criminal Justice, Culinary Arts, Mechatronics, Cyber Security. A middle college opportunity is also available for students who are interested in getting an Associates Degree while still attending high school. A full range of extracurricular activities are also provided.

Lenoir City Schools is also offering summer learning experiences for students in grades 1-8 at LCIMS and credit recovery and advancement opportunities for students in grades 9-12. The focus is to enhance the time students have to gain critical skills for accelerating achievement with lots of hands-on and active learning.

Lenoir City Schools offers a full-time online school for grades K-12. Parents who want to actively support their students online is available through the iLearn Institute. Enrollment criteria is online at lenoircityschools.com.

Loudon County Schools was able to operate successfully in-person for the entire 2020-21 school year. We believe we provided great educational opportunities to our students despite the constraints of the pandemic. We have continued this approach into the summer by offering a six-week elementary and four-week summer camp program for students needing additional reinforcement in various skills. We are operating these camps at every school with bus, food and counseling services provided to meet everyone's needs. Additionally, we have continued our summer feeding program this summer by offer weekly meals from our school sites and selected bus routes.

It is important for our school system to meet the needs of our students and community. Our teachers worked very hard to achieve our goals this last school year and continue that dedication into the summer.

The Loudon County Education Foundation has assisted our teachers in meeting their goals through various grants this last year and moving into next year. Some of our teachers were just awarded Great Idea! Grants related to math, history, assistive technology, visual arts, science, and even croquet. The Foundation is a great partner to the school system and our teachers in helping make us an exemplary school system .

We are in the process for planning the most beneficial use of our federal stimulus dollars moving into next year. We believe it is vital to utilize these one-time funds to address the learning needs of our students. We are anxious to begin the 2021-22 school year and serve our community to the best of our ability.
